ROAD MAINTENANCE PROJECT MCC NEPAL COMPACT



Roads: Poorly maintained roads create public safety risks and cost time, money, and trade opportunities. The Road Maintenance Project (RMP) will deliver cleaner, and more sustainable rehabilitation and maintenance techniques that incorporate International Road Assessment Programme (iRAP) safety standards.

The RMP will include approximately 40km of **Full-Depth Reclamation** (FDR) along the **Strategic Road Network**, recycling existing pavement material to create a new road base while minimizing cost and environmental impact.

Collaboration: The RMP is working with the Department of Roads, the Roads Board Nepal, and the Institute of Engineering at Tribhuvan University on trainings, provision of equipment, and knowledge transfer so Nepali's engineers can carry the RMP's investments forward.

Maintenance: The RMP will provide periodic maintenance on **Strategic Road Network**, with the support of matching funds to maximize funding for Nepal's road maintenance.



Road rehabilitation and network safety management to support existing and new roads.

Sustainable and **environmentally friendly technologies** such as FDR and Superpave Asphalt, which prevents shearing and cracking.

Technical assistance such as trainings, improved data collection, planning, and contract management.
