

## NEPAL AND ITS PEOPLE

(Situation, shape, area and natural divisions)

1. Nepal is a sovereign independent kingdom situated on the southern slopes of the mid-Himalayas, the formidable range of eternal snows. The nearest sea coast is about 1,127 km., from its border. It is located between  $26^{\circ}22'$  and  $30^{\circ}27'$  North latitudes and  $80^{\circ}4'$  and  $83^{\circ}12'$  East longitudes. It has an area of 147,181 sq. km. The average length from the Mechi river in the east to the Mahakali river in the west is 885 km. The north-south width is not uniform. At its widest it is 241 km., while at its least it is 145 km., yielding a mean width of 193 km.
2. Nepal's northern boundary merges with the Tibet region of the people's Republic of China. On the east it borders with the state of Sikkim and the North Bengal division of India. On the southern side it touches the Indian states of Uttar Pradesh and Bihar.
3. The major part of the country is of high mountains and rolling hills. It accounts for about 77 percent of the total land area and the remaining 23 percent is occupied by the flat lands of the Tarai. Altitude varies from 152 m. above the sea level in the Tarai in the south to more than 8839 m. in the north Himalayas. On the basis of altitude

alone, the country can be divided into three natural regions.

(a) **Himalayan (Mountain) Region :** This lies at an altitude of 4877 m. to 8839 m. above the sea level with the snow line running at 4877 m. The Himalayan ranges like the Kumbhakarna, the Jugal, the Mustang, the Ganesh, the Annapurna and the Machhapuchhre fan out from the east to the west. In this region the world's famous peaks of Mount Everest (8848m.), Kanchanjungha (8598m.), Makalu (8470m.), Dhaulagiri (8172m.) and Annapurna (8078m.) are located.

(b) **Hill Region :** This region is formed by the Mahabharat range that soars upto 4877 m. It is also known as the Mid-Himalayas. To the south of it lies the Churia range whose altitude varies from 610 to 1524 m. The two ranges enclose between them valleys of various width and altitude from 610 to 914 m. They are known as the Doons or the Inner Tarai. The hill region accounts for about 42 percent of the total land area.

(c) **Tarai Region :** The Tarai region which has a width of about 26 to 32 km. and an altitude of maximum 305 m. occupies about 23 per cent of the total land area of the country. The eastern Tarai is wider and spreads continuously while the western Tarai is narrower and irregular. The forest of the Char Kosha Jhadi, famous for big games, lies east to west. It is named after the belief that its average width is 4 Kosh (13 km).

## Rivers and Lakes

4. Situated on the southern slopes of the Himalayas, Nepal has a large number of rivers, lakes and ponds. In summer melting snow adds to their volume and ensure perennial flow of bigger rivers in particular. The river system of the country is made up of three main rivers and their tributaries. The greatest and most outstanding river is the Koshi river. It is actually a confluence of 7 rivers, Koshi, Sunkoshi, Arun, Tamor, Tama-Koshi, Indravati and Likhu. It is, therefore, known as the Sapta Koshi or the Seven Koshis. The river drains the eastern part of Nepal. The Gandaki river is also composed of 7 rivers. Its tributaries are Trisuli, Kali, Seti, Madi, Daraundi etc. At the point where all the tributaries meet, the river takes its name as Narayani. This river drains the central Nepal. The third river is Karnali which drains the western part of Nepal. Many among the big and the best known lakes occur in the Pokhara valley. They are Phewa, Roopa, Begnasa, Dipang and Medi. Phewa is the biggest lake of the valley and is quite famous. Rara lake situated at a height of about 3353m. is the biggest and most beautiful lake of the kingdom.

## Climate

5. The weather condition varies from region to region. Summer and late spring temperature ranges from more than  $40^{\circ}\text{C}$ . in the Tarai to about  $28^{\circ}\text{C}$ . in the mid-section

of the country. In winter average maximum and minimum temperatures in the Tarai range from a mild  $23^{\circ}\text{C}$ . to a brisk  $7^{\circ}\text{C}$ . while the central valleys experience chilly  $12^{\circ}\text{C}$ . maximum and the temperatures below the freezing minimum. Much colder temperatures prevail at higher elevations. Kathmandu valley which is situated at an altitude of 1300 metres has seasonable but equable climate with average summer and winter range of the temperature of  $27^{\circ}\text{C}$ — $19^{\circ}\text{C}$ . and  $20^{\circ}\text{C}$ — $2^{\circ}\text{C}$ . respectively. The annual rainfall in Kathmandu generally exceeds 1300 mm. The mean annual precipitation ranges from more than 6000 mm. along the southern slopes of the Annapurna range in the central Nepal to less than 250 mm. in the north central portion near the Tibetan plateau. Varying amounts between 1500 and 2500 mm. predominate over most of the country. On an average, about 80 percent of the precipitation is confined to the monsoon period (June—September).

## Economic Resources.

6. The most important economic resources of Nepal are forest which cover about 38% of the total land area. The principal products of the forests are timber, rafters, beams and faggots. Besides, forests supply different varieties of goods for the manufacture of furniture, indigenous paper and match boxes. Some of the minor products of the forest are herbs, drugs, fruits, tanning agents, bamboo, resin and terpentine.

7. Nepal is predominantly an agricultural country. About 91 per cent of the total population derives its livelihood from agriculture and allied activities. Main crops are paddy, maize, millet, barley, wheat, potato, jute, sugar-cane and oil seeds. In addition, tobacco is also an important product of cash crops. Tea is limitedly produced in the country and it is one of the most important products of the Ilam district. Next to agriculture, another important occupation is cottage industries. Handloom textiles form a major item in this category.

#### Race and religion

8. Nepal has a composite population stemming from various racial strands. The inhabitants of higher altitudes, Sherpas, Tamangs, Kirantis, Limbus and Bhotiyas are drawn from the Mongoloid stock.

The mid-mountains are populated by Tamangs, Magars, Gurungs, Sunwars, Newars, Brahmins and Chhetriyas. In the Inner Tarai region Tharu, Danuwar, Chepang, Magar and Indian Immigrants hold a dominant position. In recent times the development of means of transportation have, however, enabled the people to move from the hills to the Tarai and now one finds a mixture of different races in various parts of the country. The people mainly follow the Hindu and the Buddhist religions.

#### Administrative Division

9. Administratively the country is divided into the following

14 zones and 75 districts.

- (1) **Mechi Zone** : This lies on the extreme east of Nepal. It is bounded by India and Sikkim on the east, the Koshi zone on the west, the Tibetan region of the People's Republic of China on the north and India on the south. It is spread over an area of 8196 sq. kms. having 4 districts, namely Taplejung, Panchthar, Ilam and Jhapa. The Zonal headquarter is at Ilam.
- (2) **Koshi Zone** ; It is sandwiched between the Mechí Zone on the east and the Sagarmatha Zone on the west. It is bounded on the north by the Tibetan region of the People's Republic of China and by India on the south. It has an area of 9669 sq. kms. It is made of six districts, namely Sankhuwasabha, Terhathum, Dhankuta, Bhojpur, Sunsari and Morang. The zonal headquarter at present is at Biratnagar.
- (3) **Sagarmatha Zone** : It has an area of 10,591 sq. kms. Its boundaries are the Tibetan region of the People's Republic of China on the north, India on the south, the Koshi Zone on the east and the Janakpur Zone on the west. It has six districts. They are Solukhumbu, Okhaldhunga, Khotang, Udayapur, Siraha and Saptari. The zonal headquarter at present is at Rajbiraj.
- (4) **Janakpur Zone** : It also spreads out to the Tibetan Region of the People's Republic of China on the north

and India on the south. It has an area of 9,669 sq. kms. Its eastern boundary is co-terminous with the Sagarmatha zone, while it is set off on the west by the Bagmati and the Narayani zones. Dolakha, Ramechhap, Sindhuli, Mahottari, Sarlahi and Dhanusha are six districts. Its headquarter at present is at Jaleswar.

- (5) **Bagmati Zone** : It is the most developed and significant zone from every standpoint. Its area is 9,428sq. kms. Its boundaries are demarcated by the Tibetan region of the People's Republic of China on the north, the Narayani and the Janakpur zones on the south, Janakpur on the east and the Gandaki zone on the west. The eight districts included in it are Rasuwa, Dhading, Nuwakot, Sindhupalchok, Kavrepalanchok, Kathmandu, Lalitpur and Bhaktapur. Its headquarter is in Kathmandu which is also the capital of the Kingdom.
- (6) **Narayani Zone** : It lies on the south of the Bagmati and the Gandaki Zones. It is bounded on the east and the west by the Janakpur and the Lumbini zones respectively and by India on the south. It has an area of 8,313 sq. kms. Chitwan, Makawanpur, Bara, Parsa and Rauthat are its five districts. Its headquarter at present is at Birganj.
- (7) **Gandaki Zone** : It is situated in the middle of Nepal. Its boundaries are the Tibetan region of the People's Republic of China on the north, the Lumbini and the

Narayani zones on the south, the Bagmati zone on the east and the Dhawalagiri zone on the west. It has six districts. They are Manang, Lamjung, Kaski, Gorkha, Syangja and Tanahun. It has an area of 12,275 sq. kms. Its headquarter is at Pokhara.

- (8) **Lumbini Zone** : This zone is bounded by the Gandaki and the Dhawalagiri zones on the north, India on the south, the Narayani zone on the east and the Rapti zone on the west. Its six districts are Gulmi, Arghakhanchi, Palpa, Kapilbastu, Rupandehi and Nawalparasi. It has an area of 8,975 sq. kms. Presently, Butwal is the headquarter of this Zone.

- (9) **Dhawalagiri Zone** : It has four districts, Parbat, Mustang, Myagdi and Baglung forming a total area of 8,148 sq. kms. The Tibetan region of the People's Republic of China constitutes its northern boundary while it is marked off on the south, the east and the west by the Lumbini and the Rapti zones, the Gandaki and the Karnali zone respectively. It comprises of the hilly region only. Its headquarter is at Baglung.

- (10) **Rapti Zone** : This zone has an area of 10,482 sq. kms. It has five districts. They are Rukum, Rolpa, Salyan, Pyuthan and Dang Deukhuri. Its headquarter is at Tulsipur. It is bounded on the north by the Karnali and Dhawalagiri zones, India on the south, the Dhawalagiri and the Lumbini zones on the east and the Bheri zone on the west.

- (11) Karnali Zone : It is the largest of all zones with an area of 21,351 sq. kms. It is bounded on the north by the Tibetan Region of the People's Republic of China, Bheri and Rapti zones on the south, Dhawalagiri zone on the east and Seti zone on the west. It comprises five districts, namely Dolpa, Humla, Kalikot, Jumla and Mugu. Its zonal headquarter is at Jumla.
- (12) Bheri Zone : The Bheri Zone has an area of 10,545 sq. kms. Its frontiers are the Karnali zone on the north, India on the south, the Rapti zone on the east and Seti zone on the west. Dailekh, Jajarkot, Surkhet, Bardiya and Banke are its five districts. The zonal headquarter is at Nepalgunj.
- (13) Seti Zone : This zone spreading from the north to the south has an area of 12,550 sq. kms. It is bounded on north by the Tibetan region of the People's Republic of China and the Karnali zone, India on the south, the Bheri and the Karnali zones on the east and the Mahakali Zone on the west. It consists of the five districts, namely Bajhang, Bajura, Doti, Achham and Kailali. Its headquarter is at Dhangadhi.
- (14) Mahakali Zone : Spread from the Tarai to the Himalayas, It is the most westerly zone and the smallest of all having an area of 6,989 sq. kms. Its boundaries are the Tibetan region of the People's Republic of China on the north, India on the south, the Seti zone on the east and India on the west. It is

composed of four districts, namely Darchula, Baitadi, Dadeldhura and Kanchanpur. Its headquarter at present is Mahendranagar.

10. For appropriate balanced economic growth and proper attention to regional planning the country is divided into five development regions. The Eastern Development Region of which the headquarter is at Dhankuta has the total area of 28,456 sq. kms. and comprises the three zones namely Mechi, Koshi and Sagarmatha. The Central Development Region of which the headquarter is at Kathmandu has the total area of 27,410 sq. kms. and is composed of Janakpur, Narayani and Bagmati zones. The Western Development Region of which headquarter is at Pokhara has total area of 29,398 sq. kms. and comprises three zones, namely Gandaki, Lumbini and Dhawalagiri. The Mid-Western Development Region of which the headquarter is at Surkhet has total area of 42,378 sq. kms. and comprises three zones, namely Rapti, Karnali and Bheri. The fifth, Far Western Development Region of which the headquarter is at Dipayal has total area of 19,539 sq. kms. and is composed of the remaining two zones namely, Seti and Mahakali. These regions are responsible for the development work of their zones and are guided by the National Planning Commission.


